INSTITUTE FOR BIODIAGNOSTICS LIBRARY OPENS

The Canada Institute for Scientific and Technical Information will establish a CISTI Branch to provide information services to the Institute for Biodiagnostics. The Branch will also serve others, outside of NRC, who have similar subject interest.

Using a "virtual library" concept, the Branch will access and deliver much of the information electronically. The on-site collection will include publications that are considered essential to meet the immediate needs of Institute researchers. The Branch will also provide customized health sciences information services.

The CISTI Branch will work cooperatively with the region's many health science information resources located in universities, hospitals and other centres. The Branch librarian (a subject specialist and professional librarian) will provide the link between local clients, including the Industrial Research Assistance Program at NRC, and CISTI's national services in Ottawa.

The library has been opened since April although to date services have been provided through CISTI staff in Ottawa. A librarian is currently in the process of being recruited - it is hoped that staffing will be in place by year end. The library is located at 435 Ellice Avenue.

NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL LIBRARY OF MEDICINE

(as reported in Technical Trends, v.6(1/2) 1992)

Revision of the NLM Classification

The Cataloguing Section began updating the National Library of Medicine Classification in earnest this fiscal year. The objectives of this project are to publish the fifth (5th) edition of the NLM Classification by the end of 1993. This edition will incorporate additions and changes made to the Classification since publication of the fourth (4th) revised edition in 1981 and revisions to selected schedules that especially need updating, including Microbiology and Immunology, Geriatrics, Dentistry and Nursing. The Index to the Classification will be updated to include all appropriate descriptors added to MeSH since 1978 that have been used in CATLINE and have a relationship to classification numbers. Library of Congress classification numbers referenced in the Index will be updated to reflect changes in the LC class schedules and LC classification practice. The structure of the Classification will be maintained, however, existing class numbers will be expanded when there are quantities of materials clustered under a single number and new numbers will be added for new concepts. An integral part of the activity will be collecting data to develop mechanisms for revising the Classification on an ongoing basis.

NLM Current Catalog and the NLM Audiovisuals Catalog

NLM will discontinue publication of the NLM Current Catalog and the NLM Audiovisuals Catalog after the 1993 cumulations have been issued and libraries have online public access to the NLM catalog via the Internet. The primary reasons for this decision are: a) the decline in the number of subscriptions to these publications; b) the availability of the data from a variety of other sources; and; c) the cost of producing and maintaining the hardcopy publications.

The catalogs for print monographs and serials and audiovisuals cataloged for NLM's collection (with the exception of the NLM Audiovisuals Catalog, Appendix 1: Audiovisuals Serials Index), duplicate the contents on the CATLINE and AVLINE databases from which the publications are produced.

Alternatives to the NLM Current Catalog Proof Sheets

The Medical Library Association recently announced that it will cease publication of the

NLM Current Catalog Proof Sheets after 1992 ... Each weekly proofsheet contains the new English language catalog records added to CATLINE or AVLINE with current imprints, defined as imprints of the current and preceding two years. In addition, updated CIP records are pulled and printed in every fourth issue. The searches to retrieve these records can be performed by any user online to ELHILL CATLINE or AVLINE but the output options -- offline prints or downloading records -- need more investigation. Possible alternatives for CATLINE and AVLINE retrieval of current English language items cataloged by NLM will be reported in the MLA News and the NLM Technical Bulletin as soon as they are available.

SLA-TECH

The Technical Services Section of the Information Technology Division of the Special Libraries Association is sponsoring a new electronic bulletin board for those involved in or interested in technical services in the special library setting.

SLA-TECH aims to address the concerns of the small, specialized, and often one-person tech services unit. Not only do they have to do everything in their unit, but they often have no one to ask if they have questions or problems.

According to list co-owners Deborah Hatfield (KLIDSH@UKCC), and Lillian R. Mesner (LMESNER@UKCC), "we are hoping that those of us in larger units or who are more specialized in our functions can act as resources for our solitary colleagues. There are quite a number of bulletin boards for technical service areas, but most of them tend to be oriented to large academic institutions that do not have non-standard or unique needs. With this bulletin board, we are hoping that we could take care of our 'specialized' needs."



University of Winnipeg Library Goes Online



When students walk into the University of Winnipeg Library this September, they will notice computer terminals for the Library's first online public access catalogue (OPAC). In addition to the terminals on the fourth floor, near the Reference Desk, there

will be two terminals on the fifth floor in the book stacks.

The catalogue is on the BRIDGE system, currently in use at the University of Manitoba. The University of Winnipeg Library will be able to access all catalogued items in the collection that were acquired or recatalogued between 1975 and the present. The online catalogue will be updated monthly. There is a proposal to convert all remaining records to machine-readable form.

Students at the University of Manitoba and the University of Winnipeg enjoy reciprocal borrowing privileges. The high volume of usage between the two libraries makes BRIDGE a logical choice. Users with the right equipment will also be able to dial into the system from their homes or offices to consult the holdings of the two universities and the St. Boniface General Hospital Libraries.

Library staff are enthusiastic about the new system and implementation committees have worked hard this summer to prepare for BRIDGE's inauguration. Users should feel comfortable with the system within a very short time. "Help screens" are available by simply typing help and library staff will be happy to answer any questions. A number of explanatory handouts are also available.

BRIDGE is an important milestone in the ongoing automation of the University of Winnipeg Library.

The following is a list of health libraries in North Dakota. Why not check a few of them out while your at the MHLA Meeting and the State Conference in Fargo.

North Dakota State University

Library's emphasis is on agriculture, engineering, nursing, pharmacy, North Dakota and regional history. The library has 17 professionals, 13 nonprofessional, 15 clerical, 124 student assistant staff members.

428,203 Book volumes 2291 periodical subscriptions 106,781 volumes bound 3000+ audiovisuals 54,629 slides

NRI - Neuropsychiatric Research Institute

The emphasis is on neurology, neurosurgery and psychiatry. They have 8 full time staff members.

400 book titles 44 periodical subscriptions

VA Library/Southeast Clinical Campus Library
The collection emphasis is on clinical medicine.
The library has 2 professionals and 2 nonprofessional staff.

2871 book titles 300 periodical subscriptions 4105 bound volumes 515 audiovisuals

Jamestown Hospital Library

The collection emphasises allied health support. Library staff consists of 5 full time employees.

62 periodical subscriptions (also 46 noncurrent subscription titles)

Dakota Hospital Library

The collection emphasises medicine, nursing and health care in general. Staffing includes 1 librarian, 2 assistants sharing a part-time position.

2000 book titles 290 periodical subscriptions 600 audiovisual titles North Dakota State Hospital

Their collection stresses alcoholism, psychiatry, geriatrics, counselling and vocational rehabilitation. Staff includes 1 professional and 2 nonprofessional staff members.

Lake Region Hospital

The library stresses general health care, medicine and nursing. Staffing level is 1.8 full time employee.

St. Lukes Hospital

The library emphasis is on allied health, medicine, nursing and consumer health. The library staffing is 3 nonprofessional and 1 clerk.

Collection emphasis is on consumer health, employee wellness and health sciences. Staff consists of 1 professional and 1 nonprofessional.

MANITOBA HEAD INJURY ASSOCIATION

The Manitoba Head Injury Association collects statistics on accidents, casualties and injuries. Head and brain injury is often difficult to diagnose, even more difficult to treat. It is also expensive and time consuming to rehabilitate.

The Manitoba Head Injury Association(MHIA) started in 1987 when familes and friends of head injury patients and concerned health professionals organized a self-help group. The association is concerned with raising public awareness of the effects of head injury, education of the public about prevention, working with health systems to develop better quality care, developing a network of support for the head injured and their families. In 1990 the Canadian Head Injuries Coalition (CHIC) was established to serve as a bond between provincial organizations and to address issues common to them all.

The MHIA Resource Center, started by Eleanor Kamyszek in 1990, consists of books, journals, vertical file materials and audiovisuals. The resource centre provides information to members of MHIA. Though borrowing is restricted to its members, anyone is welcome

to come and browse, pick up free pamphlets and meet the staff. Rena Kroeker has been asked to establish a resource centre for the Canadian Head Injury Coalition (CHIC). It will function as a literature collecting and organizing centre for distribution to the provincial head injury resource centres. However due to a severe lack of funds, this has been slow to develop. Both the MHIA and the CHIC are located at 349 McDermot ave. We are grateful for the support from MHLA librarians. MHLA News:

The MHLA held its regular winter meeting on February 21, 1979. It was announced at that meeting that the MHLA has officially gained chapter status of the CHLA in December 1978.

The MHLA has also made a formal submission to the Health Manpwer Provincial Report. This annual publication reports on health professions in Manitoba giving such information as names, locations and duties of members in each health profession. It is the first time in Manitoba that health library personnel is included in this report.

The Manitoba Health Organization has requested that the MHLA participate in its annual conference to be held in November 1979 in the same capacity as other professional associations in Manitoba. This means funding will be forthcoming for a program that could include a guest speaker. The MHLA has previously participated in the MHO conference but has never been formally recognized until now.

Pubications Committee:

The MHLA has officially set up a Publications Committee. Its purpose is to make the activities of the MHLA known to a wider community of health library personnel throughout the province through written communication. All publications of the MHLA now come under the scrutiny of the Committee.

The first major project is the production of a core list of library material. The <u>Selected books and journals for rural Manitoba health institutions</u> is designed to assist these institutions with the

building of a core library collection. The list will include medical, nursing, allied health and long-term care materials and is scheduled for completion by early summer.

Serials Holdings List:

After a year of much hard work, a Serials Holdings List has been completed and will be available for distribution in early March. The publication lists serial holdings of major health libraries in Manitoba and will greatly help the lending between local libraries. A copy of the list along with a quide for its use will be distributed to all member iinstitutions of MHLA.

Joanne Marshall of the Health Sciences Library at McMaster University will be guest speaker at the May 9 meeting of the MHLA. She will speak on clinical librarianship.



COMPUTER ASSISTED INSTRUCTION AT ST. BONIFACE HOSPITAL

In May of 1992 a new computer Based Learning Centre ("Computer Lab" for short) was officially opened at St. Boniface General Hospital. Located in the Nursing Education Building (Room N1026), the Centre was funded through a grant from the Helene Fuld Health Trust, a U.S. Based Foundation devoted to the needs of student nurses.

At present, the Centre contains three Interactive Video workstations, six PC's and one Apple IIe. A printer is networked to all PC's. The couresware used is all interactive and consists of Interactive Video Disks (IVD's) and Computer Assisted Instruction programs (CAI's)

The response to computer-based instruction has been positive. Students and Faculty say that 24-hour a day access to the Centre's menu-driven courseware reduced many of the barriers to utilization. Faculty who have little or no exposure to computers, find access and use easier than they had initially They have begun to use computer assisted instruction as a teaching strategy, and students who have had no previous experience with computers are eager to come back and

"INFORMATION STAT: Rx FOR HOSPITAL QUALITY" Satellite Broadcast October 22 & November 5

The U of M has made arrangements to receive the live satellite broadcast described below and slated for October 22 & November 5. Exact times and place will be announced shortly. This should be a very timely and important presentation intended not only for library personnel but health care administrators, education personnel and health care professionals interested in this topic.

INFORMATION STAT: RX FOR HOSPITAL QUALITY

A two-part satellite broadcast, originating from Washington, D.C. will address the critical role that information services can play in improving hospital quality and cost-effectiveness (News, May-June 1992).

The last decade has seen a tremendous increase in the number and breadth of useful and affordable biomedical information services from literature-based databases, to factual databanks, to expert consulting systems. Many of them are supported with taxpayer dollars, including MEDLINE and some 40 other bibliographic and factual databases available from the National Library of Medicine: NLM. If readily available and consulted as needed, these services can help to diagnose infrequently seen diseases, to identify new therapeutic options, to avoid unnecessary procedures, to select less expensive equipment and to identify recently issued clinical practice and hospital service guidelines.

To promote a better understanding of the contribution these information services can make to hospital quality and efficiency, the National Library of Medicine is organizing two satellite broadcasts receivable at 8,000 hospitals in the United States, Canada and Mexico. The broadcasts will feature brief appearances by top Federal Health officials, video segments of innovative hospital library programs from around the country, and discussions of the

role of hospital-based information services involving leading hospital administrators, health professionals, and health science librarians. They will also address the need to link computer-based patient record systems to other information resources - the "IAIMS" concept - and to connect hospitals to the emerging National Research and Education Network [NREN]

The broadcasts are sponsored by the National Library of Medicine, the Medical Library Association and a number of other organizations involved in disseminating health-related information. Health-care Informatics Telecom Network is producing the broadcasts.

Hospitals are encouraged to make arrangements to receive the broadcasts for viewing by the hospital's administrators, the medical and nursing staff, the departmental managers, and other interested parties. There is no charge for receiving the programs or for arranging the satellite downlink. Videotapes of the program will be available for purchase following the broadcast.
