Newly Renovated Addictions Library

A newly renovated AFM library facility officially opened it's doors to the general public on October 27th, 1993. Named in honour of Rev. William Potoroka, who devoted 22 years to the field of alcohol and drug education, the library collection at the Addictions Foundation of Manitoba is the most comprehensive of it's kind in Manitoba.

The history of the Library dates back to the very roots of the AFM when on April 27, 1952 an Information Centre was opened as a service of the Committee on Alcoholism for Manitoba. The committee became the Alcoholism Foundation of Manitoba in 1956. With a tiny nucleus of books, the Library was firmly established in the 1970's to serve AFM staff, funded agencies and the public. Since that time. the modest collection has increased dramatically and the library system has grown considerably. The library is integral to the AFM's mission of awareness and research.

Beyond the traditional library services, reference, inter-library loans, computer searches, and circulating books, the AFM library is unique among addictions libraries in the broad range of other activities and services it provides. For example, it distributes more audiovisuals than any of the other addictions libraries

surveyed and is the central distribution point for all AFM pamphlets and pamphlets purchased for distribution. A recent statistical profile of patrons and use of the AFM library indicates that it serves the Manitoba public from a variety of sectors and with a variety of resources: 74% of the audiovisual and book loans are made to the general public with the remaining 26% made to AFM staff members for their use with local communities and clients: a review of users indicated that educational organizations are the single largest users of informational mailings; audiovisuals were loaned out 4224 times in 90/91; 3476 individuals, over and above staff, continued page 3

From the President

The panic button has been hit in the Canadian retail market because Walmart has bought in to the country. Why are retailers worried? Because Walmart practices the old maxim "the customer is always right". All the articles discussing this "invasion" tell how Walmart really believes in customer service, and that is why customers become regulars. How does this apply to MHLA libraries? I think all of us in libraries have at times lost touch with our customers. Are we doing what they want or what we think they want?

The service feature most often mentioned in regard to Walmart is the greeter that always welcomes customers into the store and makes sure they are directed to the product section they wish to locate. This simple service has made Walmart the merchandising leader, because one reason customers get irritated is that they can't find what they want, and worse, no one seems to care. I feel fairly sure that the same thing happens in libraries. I relearned that when I spent two months working as a researcher at the King's Fund Library in London, England. Suddenly, I was the library innocent. I found their organization of materials confusing, their cataloguing system baffling, and even their photocopy machine was foreign to me. Now of course, we can say that the staff would be willing to help if I had asked, and I know that that was true. But still, even though I knew the staff, the unspoken message transmitted to me by the activity at the desk was "not now, I'm busy". I might add, for anyone who does not know me, that I'm not one to be intimidated easily, so you wouldn't say that was the reason I failed to ask. I would have appreciated an official greeter at the front door! Perhaps we should all be providing the equivalent of that service. Think about it.

came in to use the library in 1991.

Frequently, individuals affected by the substance abuse of a family members or their own use, first come to the Library to try and understand the problem. The Library offers an anonymous safe way to get more information. In a typical situation, recently a woman came in for some information and was surprised to find the variety of books and audiovisual materials related to the family. she was most grateful that she was able to take videos home for family viewing.

Students and teachers from all levels of education use the resource. Sometimes the benefit goes well beyond their school needs. For example, a high school student came in looking for material for a high school project. In addition to the material he needed for this project, he spent considerable extra time reading material related to substance abuse and its effect on children of alcoholics. Later he told the Library staff that he came from a family involved in substance abuse.

It is seldom known if these patrons subsequently ask for more treatment-oriented assistance; or whether the access to information gives them the insight and strength to change their situation. Many however, have written to the AFM to express their thanks. Other professionals, such as the media, physicians, and health care workers are impressed by the information and primary research material available to them.

The renovation project was a result of a study completed in the Fall of 1990 to determine the requirements for improving service delivery of the Library Program. The new facility has enhanced the physical environment and space of the Library to accommodate expanded usage, efficiency and access to resources, as well as the improvement of overall security and access for the handicapped. The Addictions Foundation of Manitoba extends

The completed renovation has opened the doors to further development of the information materials and resources being The funds made available by offered. Corporate donations will offer the AFM the ability to purchase new video, print and other resource information needed to meet the growing demands for specific information on issues such as compulsive gambling. The near future introduction of integrated computerization services for staff and public users will allow for dissemination of information spanning a number of disciplines, to an increasing number of computer literate patrons.

"Based on the past five years, we can expect a 25% increase in service demands over the next three years", states librarian Rita Schreiber. "These new resources will permit us to meet these needs by providing readily accessible, timely and objective information."

The Winnipeg Health Care Bulletin Board System

This computer BBS is intended as an informal meeting place for anyone with an interest in healthcare in Manitoba. The system is being run as a hobby, so there are no user fees. (The sysop is a Registered Medical Lab Technologist.) It is open to anyone with a computer and a modem.

In addition to a couple of local Winnipeg message areas, the BBS is also part of the International FidoNet. Users can read and reply to messages on a variety of health topics from people all over North America and the world. Some of the available Fido Echos are the International Nurses Network, Grand Rounds medical echo, Diabetes echo, and Anxiety and Stress Management echos to name a few.

While the system is intended to be primarily for the exchange of messages related to health, there is also a small file area with a few health/medical related programs, textfiles, and graphics for downloading.

The BBS operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and operates at modem speeds up to and including 14,400 bps. It is a single line system, and the number is 831-5375

The theme of the conference being the "Virtual Library", there will be a number of sessions involving LANs, CD-ROMs, ways of using the Internet, all about Freenets, Hytelnet, Gopher space, Archie, Jughead, and Veronica....and much more (Little Lulu, perhaps?)

The Keynote speaker is Michael Eisenberg, Professor at the School of Information Studies, Syracuse University in New York, and Director of ERIC, who will also be giving a session of School Libraries and the Internet. Anne Lipow of the University of California, Berkeley, will be speaking on the stresses and strains of working in the electronic environment, as well as moderating a "reference rap"**, and presenting a session on teaching Internet to the uninitiated.

Other speakers include Peter Scott from the University of Saskatchewan, presenting sessions on Hytelnet and Freenets, and Denis Marshall from Queen's University, speaking about the copyright implications of electronic information. MHLA's program will address Document Delivery in the Virtual library, details in the box below.

In addition to exhibits, vendors will showcase their products and services in sessions running concurrent with the regular programming. These will add to the variety of interesting options available to delegates at any given time throughout the conference.

The conference venue is the Days Inn Marlborough Hotel. Social events include a wine and cheese opening reception on the evening of Wednesday May 25th, and dinners on Thursday and Friday nights. MHLA's annual general meeting will be held on the evening of Thursday the 26th, followed by a social get-together with other Association meeting participants afterwards.

DOCUMENT DELIVERY IN THE VIRTUAL LIBRARY (Thuraday, May 26th, 10:45 - 12:00 noon)

New forms of technology are rapidly altering the landscape of information storage and retrieval, and hence our capacity to access and disseminate information. These developments have demanded radical transformation in the tasks librarians perform to fulfil their functions as information selectors, organizers, and disseminators. Ongoing changes in the tasks, technology, and structures developed to accomplish these tasks have tremendous import for libraries and information professionals.

This panel will examine one aspect of these developments - document delivery - and will discuss practicability, pitfalls, and tie-ins to advances in information technology within the electronic or "virtual" library setting. Contrasting visions, values and priorities of commercial vendors and library professionals will also be under discussion.
