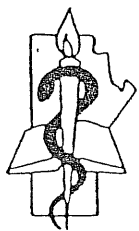

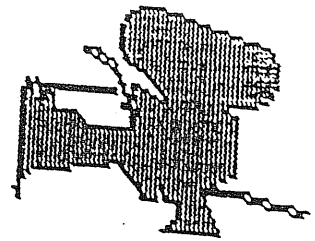

April is cancer month. In this issue the Audio Visual Interest Group is featuring a selection of the many films and videos available at the Canadian Cancer Society - Manitoba Division.

There is a wide selection of films, videos and pamphlets on topics ranging from smoking to breast and uterine cancer. These are of general interest and may be borrowed by any responsible person, organization or institution in the province of Manitoba. There is no rental charge for films/videos. The Society will arrange and pay for courier delivery. Borrowers are expected to do the same when films/videos are returned. Advance booking of three weeks is required. The Patient Services Department currently has approximately 30 films and videos available for loan to professionals. Some are to be used as volunteer training aids. Others contain information for cancer patients and their families. Below we have highlighted five of these films and videos. YOU AND BONE MARROW TRANSPLANT, Produced for the Princess Margaret Hospital, Toronto, 1987. 29 min. VHS

Prepares young people suffering from some intractable leukemias for the experience of bone marrow transplant. The procedures are shown, including whole body radiation and chemotherapy. The hospital staff speak honestly about the hazards and side effects of this treatment and the chances of survival. Former patients speak frankly about the physical and emotional changes they went through during and after the procedure.

THE CLERGY IN CANCER MANAGEMENT, American Cancer Society, 1976. 27 min. 3/4"

Explores the role of clergy in undertaking a broader responsibility with cancer patients, as part of the rehabilitation team. The problems and opportunities are dramatized through a variety of patients counselled by the clergy of several faiths and through discussion between the clergy and medical team. The emphasis here is on awakening hope and a commitment to living rather than on ministering to the dying. Many questions are raised with some solutions proposed - not as a formula but as a stimulus to further discussion among the clergy and with the medical profession.

WHEN A CHILD HAS CANCER, American Cancer Society. 23 min. 16mm

The progress that has been made over the years with respect to childhood cancer and helping parents to cope is examined. Topics such as marital stress, grandparents, school problems, siblings' needs and reactions, non-medical costs, drugs, treatments, parent self-help groups are discussed in this film.

CANCER: IT'S TREATMENT AND CURE, VHS

This video includes the following: Introduction, what is cancer?, types of therapy ie. surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy, and a summary.

NO FEARS, NO TEARS, British Columbia/Yukon Division, Canadian Cancer Society, 1986. 28 min. Beta.

Children and their parents can learn to cope with the procedures of cancer treatment, which may be painful and frightening. Supplemented by a 20 page guide describing the coping techniques shown in the video.

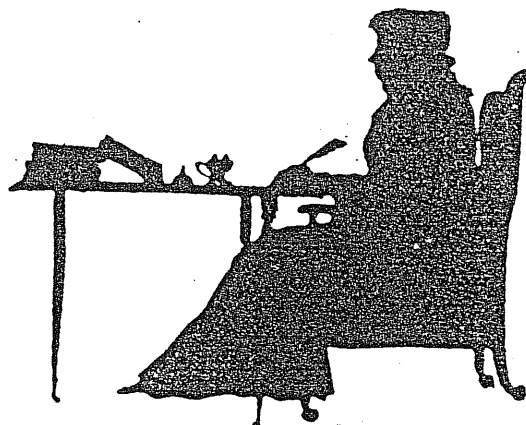
