Letters to the editor

The Serials Committee is happy to report that all twenty-five additional copies of the *Union list* have been sold. Copies have been sent to health libraries throughout Manitoba and to two libraries in Saskatchewan. If you were planning to order a copy, please let a member of the Committee know. This will help us to determine how many lists to order for the next edition.

While praising the *List* in the September newsletter, our editor also expressed some niggling questions about the form of a few entries to which the Committee would like to respond.

The appearance of the titles *JAMA* and the *Journal of the American Medical Association* is not a duplication. *Journal of the American Medical Association* is the earlier form of the title. Both earlier and later titles are connected by see references (AD and EX).

However, our editor is correct in pointing out that the titles *American journal of occupational therapy* and *AJOT*, with holdings split between them, should not both be used; and clearly the appearance of both *Nursing* amd *Nursing88* is another example of non-standardization.

This simply points out that the work of producing a *Union list* requires the combined efforts of many: the publisher (in maintaining a database of accurate, standardized bibliographic records to which our titles and holdings information are attached), the contributors (in submitting complete, accurate titles and holdings information), and the Committee (in setting policy, instructing and undertaking prepublication checking).

For the present, the Committee is continuing to solicit corrections and suggestions to the *List* and would like to encourage the membership to give thought to the new edition due for publication in 1991.

Editor's note: I stand corrected on the example of the JAMA- a closer read should have caught that. AACR2r rule 12.1B2 apparently is aimed

specifically at eliminating title changes caused by marketing-inspired stylized initialisms at head of title. The national cataloguing agencies have already gone back and recatalogued some titles originally treated as changes due to stylistic devices. On another note, you will find changes to the *Union list* of a different kind on pages 5-8 of your *News*, coyly placed in the middle so you can open up the staple, snap out that section and tuck it neatly into your *Union list*.

MHINET established jointly by MHO/MARN/HSC

In parallel votes, the Boards of Manitoba Health Organizations, Inc. (MHO) and the Manitoba Association of Registered Nurses (MARN), in conjunction with the Health Sciences Centre, approved the two-year funding of MHINET, the Manitoba Health Information Network, to be physically located at the HSC in Winnipeg. Unlike its predecessor and model, WHINET, which ran as an 18 month demonstration during 1983-1985, the new service extends to nurses and administrators throughout the province and includes a document delivery service through the facilities of the HSC as well as provisions for continuing education and consultation for local information providers. Manual and online reference services will be available through telephone lines. **Specialized** bibliographies and current awareness tools will be compiled and maintained by MHINET staff and routed to individuals and libraries.

The project, which started in January of this year, is expected to at least partially fill the void left by the closing of the MARN library last fall. Rural nurses have already begun funneling requests for materials to the HSC even while staffing for MHINET remains unsettled.

LC rebuffed on royalties from offshore MARC sales

James Billington, Librarian of Congress, has been sending ripples of fear through the hearts of many a cataloguer and cataloguing vendor over the past 12 months. A shortfall of \$.5 million dollars in revenue generated by the Cataloging Distribution Service prompted Billington to seek licensing fees bibliographic utilities and other heavy users of LC MARC records. Licensing fees are already charged by most other national producers, at least one of whom (Australia) also collects licensing fees on the redistribution of LC's records within their country. LC's move was seen as a direct threat to the livelihood of UTLAS, WLN, RLIN and OCLC, who mount LC tapes on-line and on CD-ROM for reuse by Also to be affected were the CD-ROM only vendors, such as GRC (Laserquest), Gaylord (SuperCat), and the Library Corporation (Bibliofile), who tend to sell to smaller libraries which can ill afford to pay any additional costs.

At first, challenges from the library community under the U.S. Freedom of information act halted action on resale of LC cataloguing within the U.S., but MARC tapes sold to foreign agencies or to foreign libraries through U.S. firms were seen as likely targets of increased charges. OCLC and the OCLC Users' Council were among the first to voice strong opposition to LC's plans as this would have had serious implications for their profitability abroad. Canadian libraries using LC records supplied by Utlas Inc., TKM, and even the National Library of Canada could have been subject to the levies, adding to the already high cost of cataloguing in this country.

At a special ALCTS (Association for Library Collections and Technical Services) debate on this issue scheduled for ALA Midwinter in Chicago, LC backed down on the licensing issue due to the strong reaction from libraries across the continent. For 1990 subscriptions they have decided to implement price increases as a way of recovering costs plus 10% as required by U.S. law. As a result, prices are expected to rise by 30% in the U.S. and by 39% in Canada. In case you are curious, the National Library of

Medicine has had a policy of using a domestic/foreign price differential for NLM MARC and Medline tapes for some time.

"Bridge opening" slated for spring - includes holdings of SBGH libraries and U of M

The long awaited unveiling of public access to Bridge, the University of Manitoba/St. Boniface General Hospital implementation of the Unisys PALS system is now slated for May. Available to some staff since last November, the Bridge database now includes over 450,000 titles catalogued through Utlas by the Fort Garry and Medical campuses of the University plus another 4,000 catalogued at the hospital through Utlas and Bibliofile. As retrospective conversion continues at both the Helene Fuld and McEwan Libraries at SBGH and at the University, the size of the database is expected to swell to close to 700,000 titles by 1991. The University expects to provide Bridge service to the general public much as they presently do for UMSEARCH. Access to the public will be by dedicated terminal at host sites and by modem into UMNET externally. More information on access to Bridge may be obtained through Pat Nicholls at Dafoe Library, 474-6618.

While the University's records have been publically available on-line for some time, and the Carolyn Sifton Library's since 1989, Bridge will be the first OPAC to show the holdings of St. Boniface's Fuld (Nursing) Library (I'm so proud- the editor!).

Once entered into PALS, records may be retrieved by the usual author, title and subject access and by keywords in those and the note fields as well. Searches may be qualified by format (series, maps, audio-visual media, etc.), by date, or by language. Display can be either mnemonically tagged (i.e. TITL, AUTH, SUBJ, NOTE, etc.) or MARC.

Once the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is up and running, attention will be Continued on page 9

paid to implementing the circulation module, most likely by this summer. It is expected that Acquisitions will follow in early 1991 with Serials Check-in coming somewhat later. Once Circulation is up, the patron will be able to determine availability of material at the catalogue. In addition, it will be possible to determine periodical holdings at the issue levela useful tool for ILL requesting. Once Acquisitions is implemented, the patron should be able to retrieve on-order records as easily as those already received- by keyword, by subject, and so on.

CD-ROM users complain of response time degradation

Users of Silver Platter, Wilsondisc, and Compact Cambridge CD-ROM databases report some problems with response time which seem to be traceable to two sources: Philips drive units and rebooting or turning off the host computer (or printer) without properly exiting from the search software or letting a print job run its course. Participants in the PACS-L conference on Bitnet report situations where their software has even locked up due to a lack of hard disk space. Losses of up to 10MB were noted.

The problem occurs when disk areas allocated as temporary storage for printing or displaying are not reclaimed when a user is through working at a CD-ROM station. Since these temporary work areas are not "logical" files recorded on the disk's FAT (file allocation table), they do not display when the DIR command is given. The remedy is to run CHKDSK/F from DOS. When queried "Convert lost clusters to files?", answer N and your missing disk space is recovered until the next time a frustrated patron shuts off the computer while stuck in the middle of a search or decides they have printed enough citations to do their paper. One librarian loading chkdsk into AUTOEXEC.BAT file (the first file to be executed whenever the system is booted). The command ECHO IN CHKDSK/F> nul in your AUTOEXEC file causes the system to run chkdsk and answer No to the "Convert lost clusters..." question whenever the system is rebooted. Anyone experiencing degradation of response time with their CD-ROM software might want to try this. A second librarian urges caution when doing this. He suggests that it is best to do a simple CHKDSK before doing CHKDSK/F to determine that lost clusters are the only problem.

PACS-L network offers on-line help through Bitnet

A listsery conference dedicated to sharing concerns and news of all manner of library online databases was initiated in July by the University of Houston using the services of Bitnet, the international academic electronic mail system operated without profit by Educom. Topics raised on the conference include everything from the mundane (where can I get a Hitachi CD-ROM drive repaired) to the sublime (full text databases). Not all of the information is useful, and unfortunately one has to wade through all of it, since there is no index to the incoming messages and they arrive at a 10-20 perday! Access Netnorth/Bitnet is free and is available to academics through their campus computer system.



Results of the Interlibrary Loan charges survey

At the last MHLA meeting the members decided to conduct a survey on Interlibrary Loan charges in member libraries. This survey was suggested to help libraries set a fee for their institution for the cost of receiving and sending ILL's by fax machines. It was also done to assess how varied the Interlibrary Loan charges currently are with an eye to the possibility of setting up a uniform charging system within our member libraries. Following are the results of this survey.

CONCLUSION

There seems to be a wide variety of Interlibrary Loan charges within our member libraries. I believe that it would be better for the clients who have access to more than one of our member libraries if we were to have a uniform charging system. Realistically though, I am not sure it would be possible to arrive at a uniform charging system that would be acceptable to all the member libraries.

Concerning the Fax charges, there are not enough libraries currently using fax machines to be able to determine a prevelant policy.



Short evaluation of the spring Media Preview from February 20-April 28, 1989

Nine institutions participated: Concordia, Seven Oaks, Misericordia, Deer Lodge, Grace, Victoria, Health Sciences Centre, St. Boniface and Brandon. Ten different programmes from three distributors were available for preview. After the preview evaluation questionnaires were sent out and 7 were returned. Generally the spring preview was viewed positively by all.

Some specific comments: videotapes were current and appropriate. Time of year (spring) is better than fall. The viewing time per institution was one week, but this was too short for some, because of the Easter long weekend within this period. All institutions felt that they saved time and energy and money by participating in the program. Most felt that 10 tapes was an appropriate number to view in one week and they thought that there was a good variety of clinical and general tapes. Some felt that the written correspondence and directions received from the AV committee were not quite clear. All institutions are interested in another preview in the future. Some topics suggested were: ethical issues, care of the elderly, abuse of the elderly and health promotion topics.
