
JUDY INGLIS CANADIAN HOSPITAL LIBRARIAN OF THE YEAR

The following letter was sent to CHLA/ABSC to nominate Judy for hospital librarian of the Year.

We would like to nominate Mrs. Iudv Inglis for t h e CHLA/ABSC Canadian Hospital Librarian of the Year Award. It would seem fitting to have a librarian who contributed so much to our profession and to health care, both locally and nationally, as the

first recipient of this valuable award.

Judy is the Librarian of the J. W. Crane Memorial Library at Deer Lodge Centre in Winnipeg. This is a Library which, under her direction, has become a national resource for the literature of geriatric health care. When Judy took over the hospital library in 1985, it was a small in-house reading room of a hospital which had just been designated as a geriatric centre for the Province. She believed that the Library, too, should become a provincial resource in keeping with the goals and objectives of her institution. To that end, she successfully



obtained external funds to develop and implement a provincial information service which is considered one of the strongest and most innovative in the Province.

When the Canadian Geriatric Research Society decided to close the J. W. Crane Library in Toronto, Judy submitted a proposal to them to bring their library resources here

and to provide from here a national information service in geriatric care. The success of her proposal, and implementation now provides a national model of a superior library service which has contributed significantly to health care. The innovative and cost-effective service has impressed government agencies here. It has certainly improved the recognition of the importance of hospital librarianship to health care and has attracted attention, and support from health care providers and administrators in Canada.

COME TOGETHER A message from the President

This will be the second consecutive year that MHLA holds its Annual General Meeting in Conjunction with the Manitoba Library Association Conference. This joint gathering pools the strengths of the library associations involved and offers more choices to all of our members. For those who hold overlapping memberships in MHLA, MLA, MALT, CASLIS and MSLAVA it covers all their conference bases in one concentrated event. This is especially important for members who must travel to attend any of these annual meetings.

Personally, I have been in a unique position during the past two years. At the same time that I have been President-Elect/President of MHLA, I was elected and served on the Board of Directors of MLA (1992-94). As a result of this informal liason, I was able to promote awareness of the concerns and achievements of health libraries at the provincial level. Conversely, MLA gained from the active inclusion of our members and their talents. I believe we should seek a way to achieve this connection on a more formal basis.

I am not advocating that MHLA give up its separate existence. We will always have particular interests that MHLA serves very well, and we benefit from our chapter status with CHLA. I do hope we can find a means to associate more formally with MLA in a manner similar to the North Dakota model. Our health library counterparts there remain separate to deal with issues related to health libraries, the National Library of Medicine and the Medical Library Association; but they hold a guaranteed seat at the state library association council for the purpose of addressing broader library issues.

Manitoba's splintered library community needs a similar unified body to represent all of us on such issues as funding, legislative actions, and network planning. Let us all come together, not just at the spring conference, but in a more permanent and meaningful way.

Throughout her career, Judy has provided the type of innovation combined with careful planning and intelligent administration which has made her present work so successful. Although two of her earlier positions were physically based in an academic library, the mandate of each of them involved the improvement of hospital libraries. As Extension Librarian of the Medical Library, University of Manitoba, Judy provided consultation on and encouragement for, the many small hospital libraries in the province. developed strong resource sharing tools and links for hospital libraries throughout Manitoba. She was a strong - and successful - advocate for the importance of current and accurate information for the provision of good quality health care.

From 1980 through 1982, Judy planned and implemented an experimental information service for health professionals in Winnipeg; it was funded for the two year period as a demonstration project with a grant from the Winnipeg Foundation. She designed the service to deliver the information required to support good patient care efficiently and effectively through the network of hospital libraries, thus emphasizing how important even the small hospital library was in the health care world. The project was so well received that the Manitoba Association of Registered Nurses and the Manitoba Health Organizations (an umbrella organization for hospitals in the province) elected to continue the service even after the initial grant was completed. The service continues today as the Manitoba Health Information Network and Judy serves as a member of its Board of Directors.

Judy's contribution to hospital librarianship is not confined to the workplace. She has provided leadership in her chosen profession both locally and nationally. Over the years she has played an important role in our professional organizations. Her administrative skills, her enthusiasm, and her commitment to excellence provide leadership to her colleagues. Her generosity to and encouragement of her co-workers is legendary. As co-chairman of the conference planning committee for 1991, she orchestrated our very successful conference in Winnipeg; a success

which was attested to by all who attended. She has had much to do with the development of the Manitoba Health Libraries Association, serving in many different capacities including President and, last year, she developed an outstanding set of objectives for the future direction of the Association.

Her understanding of hospital libraries themselves is most useful in the development of national hospital library standards. Her understanding of the health care system, and the role to be played within it by our hospital libraries, makes her contribution as the CHLA/ABSC representative to the Canadian Council on Health Accreditation particularly valuable. The successful services she has developed, and her ability to clearly articulate the importance of information services in health care provide strong advocacy for hospital libraries in Canada. Judy brings honour and respect to our profession.

We attach Judy's curriculum *vitae* in which she has, in typically modest fashion, briefly listed her work. We hope that this short letter to tell a little more of how important her achievements are for all of us, both locally and nationally, will help you to evaluate the strength of her contribution to hospital librarianship in Canada. We truly believe that honouring Judy, whose accomplishments are respected by colleagues in libraries and in health care, would be a fine beginning for the Canadian Hospital Librarian of the Year Award.

This computer BBS is intended as an informal meeting place for anyone with an interest in healthcare in Manitoba. The system is being run as a hobby, so there are no user fees. (The sysop is a Registered Medical Lab Technologist.) It is open to anyone with a computer and a modem.

In addition to a couple of local Winnipeg message areas, the BBS is also part of the International FidoNet. Users can read and reply to messages on a variety of health topics from people all over North America and the world. Some of the available Fido Echos are the International Nurses Network, Grand Rounds medical echo, Diabetes echo, and Anxiety and Stress Management echos to name a few.

While the system is intended to be primarily for the exchange of messages related to health, there is also a small file area with a few health/medical related programs, textfiles, and graphics for downloading.

The BBS operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and operates at modem speeds up to and including 14, 400 bps. It is a single line system, and the number is 831-5375.

Arndt, Kenneth A. Information excess in medicine: overview, relevance to dermatology, and strategies for coping. <u>Archives of Dermatology</u> 1992 Sept; 128: 1249-1256.

AB: The amount of biomedical information contained in scientific journals has grown to the point that complete coverage of this material is impossible. The number of articles and journals being published has been growing at an exponential rate since 1750. Thirty-four thousand references form 4000 journals are added each month to the National Library of Medicine MEDLINE databases from among the more than 100 000 scientific journals now published. This

increase in scientific literature reflects not greater productivity but simply a larger number of scientists at work. Most articles written are eventually published in the medical literature, but a large number of scientific articles are of less than optimal quality, and most scientific articles that are published are never cited. Articles of higher quality and usefulness cluster in a few journals that enjoy great use in medical libraries and high scores on bibliometric scores such as the *Science Citation Index*. Yeah tell us something we don't know.

Valnicek-SM; Chasmar-LR; Clapson-JB. Frostbite in the prairies: a 12 year review. <u>Plast-Reconstr-Surg</u> 1993 Sep; 92(4): 633-41.

AB: a 12 year retrospective review of inpatient frostbite injury was undertaken in three tertiary hospitals serving a northern prairie population of 650,000. In the 125 patients identified, the mean age was 41 years, with a range of 3 to 90 years. Predisposing factors were alcohol consumption (46 percent), psychiatric illness (17 percent), vehicular trauma(19 percent), vehicular failure (15 percent), and drug use (4 percent). Profound hypothermia with a core temperature less than 32 degrees C was present in 12 percent. Anatomic distribution was 19 percent upper extremity, 47 percent lower extremity, 31 percent combined upper and lower extremity, and 3 percent facial or trunk only.

Factors correlating with amputation of parts(p < 0.05) were duration of exposure, lack of proper attire, remote site of injury, presence of wound infection, and delay in seeking treatment. Prophylactic systemic antibiotics did not decrease the incidence of wound infection. Comparison with nine other civilian series revealed striking similarities in the patient populations. *I can relate*



Titbits from the Internet

Several MEDLIBers asked to have a summary of responses to my query regarding librarians complaints' about doctors. The question was generated by one of our doctors, a speaker at MLA-Hospital Libraries Section panel. He will speak with an administrator and a nurse as library "customers" on Monday May 16th from 4:00-5:30. It wasn't exactly "flame city" but there were quite a few HOT responses! I hope I do you all justice and I sure appreciate the input. It should liven up the talk! There were 16 responses from all over the USA and Canada--from University and Hospital Libraries of all Everyone had more than 1 complaint (surprise?). So here goes:

First--All but one praise MOST physicians. MOST are gracious, appreciative, generous, courteous, self-sufficient, and good library users.

Our doctor/speaker (M. Corman M.D.) is a brave man should be thanked for listening, is rare, and we can't wait to hear him speak.

Now the COMPLAINTS:

- 1. RUSH requests that are never picked up or forgotten
- 2. Search and ILL requests phoned forwarded by office staff who are "clueless" about the questions, journal etc.
- 3. Poor or partial citations for ILLs, especially from "memory"
- 4. Online searching—think it is easy, expect too much from computers, give vague request (i.e. everything recent on breast cancer by noon), losing searches, etc. 5. Poor ATTITUDE—want immediate attention, keep books as private collection then complain if a book is out, misuse copy machine, phones, desk (esp. residents here)
- 6. Hire clerical people and send them for library training.
- 7. Expect complicated service on "drop-in" basis (e.e. teach Grateful Med, how to make slides, etc. NOW!)
 8. Retired DOCS cleaning out garages & attics to "donate" tons of out-of-date texts & journals, then want tax letter.
- Fear of computers won't even try poor learners.
 Treat librarians like clerks not professionals.
- 11. Doctors in position of power do not use that "clout" to support the high quality library and librarians they need allow "mediocrity" while they support other causes while they say they LOVE our libraries.

I hope I did justice to all your wonderful comments. Some of the "fun" comments were the "what ifs" - what if we called secretary to relay a direct medical question - what if we "dropped in" and asked for

complicated office procedure NOW - what if we interrupt them on pone to another doc - what if we said we could learn their job in a minute or two.

The Virtual Hospital: A new Paradigm for Electronic Publishing in the Health Sciences

The Virtual Hospital (VH) is a continuously updated medical multimedia database stored on computers and accessed through high speed computer networks 24 hours a day. The VH will provide invaluable patient care support and distance learning to health science practitioners. The VH's information may be used to answer patient care questions, thus putting the latest medical information at practioners' fingertips. This same information may be used for continuing medical education(CME); delivering CME to practitioners offices and homes at a convenient time and location.

The VH's medical media is stored in a multimedia database on a file server (storage computer) linked to the Internet, the data superhighway of today. The media is organized into medical multimedia textbooks (MMTBs). A MMTB is a multimedia software program that patterns its user interface after a printed textbook but incorporates functions beyond those of a printed textbook. The MMTB provides free text searching and the ability to play video and audio clips. The multimedia database is organized using the World Wide Web (WWW) software technology. The WWW facilitates the acquisition, storage, and organization of information on the Internet. WWW file servers organize and store information in a coherent knowledge structure or "web," while WWW clients, available for all major personal computers, are the tools that the user employs to access the information that it contains.

The VH will contain MMTB's, diagnostic algorithms, patient simulations, teaching files, historical information, and patient instructional and CME materials. Information fro the VH is being gathered form lectures, teaching conferences and grand rounds in all of our Health Science Colleges.

The VH is currently undergoing initial loading and proofing of context, and will be fully operational in the next 2 months. In the interim. there is already a large amount of useful medical information within it, so please stop by and browse. The Virtual Hospital is a service of the Electric Differential Multimedia Lab in the Department of Radiology in the University of Iowa College of Medicine.

DOCLINE COMES TO CANADA By Bev Brown

Important new initiatives are underway to improve resource sharing among health libraries in Canada. Chief among these is the introduction of NLM's DOCLINE system into Canada. In this article I will describe the system and the DOCLINE trials in western Canada. In a future article I hope to give the University of Manitoba Medical Library experience with DOCLINE and describe how the health library associations are collaborating to improve resource sharing. The information in this first article owes much to the reports Jim Henderson had published in BMC. (1,2)

DOCLINE is the automated interlibrary loan system developed by the National Library of Medicine for use by health libraries in the United States. NLM designed the system to be simple to learn and to use. It was first implemented in 1985 and now includes more than 2500 libraries.

With appropriate software, DOCLINE can interface with Grateful Med, the computer program that provides end user access to MEDLARS. This document ordering feature of Grateful Med, called Lonesome Doc, allows a user to order articles directly form a DOCLINE library.

The heart and soul of DOCLINE are two databases -- SERLINE and SERHOLD. SERLINE is the database of serials titles held by NLM and the libraries participating in DOCLINE. SERHOLD is the database of library holdings for SERLINE titles. The link between the two databases is through a special number called the Title Control Number (TCN). For a requested journal to be obtained via Docline, it must be entered in SERLINE and in SERHOLD.

GETTING STARTED

To use DOCLINE, a library must:

- 1. Have a connection to the Internet
- 2. Apply to NLM for a library identifier code and a SERHOLD code.
- 3. record holdings in SERHOLD

4. apply for an ID and password.

In order to avoid any charges associated with using DOCLINE, Canadian libraries will have to connect through the Internet. Though this may seem to be a major hurdle at the present time, indications are that hospitals and hospital libraries will soon have access. Even now, the costs to access the Internet in Manitoba through MbNet are quite reasonable.

Once the Internet connection is obtained, the library registers as a DOCLINE participant and is assigned a unique library identifier. Associated with this identifier is information on the library contact names and phone numbers, ILL policies, pricing and lending restrictions - all of which can be browsed by other DOCLINE libraries

The next step is for the library to apply for a SERHOLD code and to load serials holdings into SERHOLD.

The library then applies for an ID and password to logon to DOCLINE. A routing table must also be filled out that identifies the libraries that you will send ILL requests to and in what order. Up to 180 libraries may be entered.

DOCLINE ADMINISTRATION IN CANADA

In the U.S. , health libraries are grouped hierarchically, first arcund the local academic medical library, then a regional library, and finally NLM. DOCLINE reflects this organization - libraries borrow first locally and then regionally. In Canada the regional networks are not always so clearly drawn. In the NLM may of regions, Canada is defined as Region 22, with CISTI as the regional library for all of Canada and our link with NLM. Because CISTI does not have the financial resources to be the NLM of the North, the expansion of DOCLINE requires the collaborative efforts of CISTI, CHLA/ABSC and the academic medical libraries (ACMC/SRCMSL). These three groups currently are exploring

mechanisms for working together to ensure that health information is better shared in Canada.

For Canadian libraries, there is no charge to use the software that runs DOCLINE. In addition, NLM is willing to add titles to SERLINE that are unique to Canadian libraries. CHLA/ABSC currently is negotiating with CISTI to cover the costs to individual libraries of initially entering holdings to SERHOLD.

USING DOCLINE

Requesting an article using DOCLINE can be as simple as typing a number. the DOCLINE system resides on its own computer at NLM but is linked to MEDLINE and other NLM files. This means that a library can request a MEDLINE article using only the unique identifier number. You do not need to type in location information. DOCLINE automatically routes your request to the first library in your routing table whose holdings in SERHOLD match your request.

Certain features of DOCLINE encourage rapid filling of ILL requests. Libraries are expected to read incoming ILL requests daily (except those staffed part-time). The request will automatically route to the next potential lender if not picked up within twenty-four hours. You can also check on the progress of a request and a date can be specified after which the request should not be filled.

A lending library can refuse to fill a request if the charges will be more than the maximum the borrowing library is willing to pay. In such cases, the request is routed to the next library.

THE CANADIAN TRIALS

In Canada, DOCLINE has been a Western Canadian initiative. The Woodward Biomedical Library at UBC and many hospital and health libraries in British Columbia have been using DOCLINE for the past year. In June a major DOCLINE trial is to begin, encompassing the Medical and Dental Libraries at the University of Manitoba, the two university medical libraries in Alberta, and a small number of hospital libraries

in Edmonton. In addition, the southern Alberta CHLA/ABSC chapter is about to enter holdings into SERHOLD. A call recently from a library in the Northwest Territories indicates how extensive the interest is.

To date, the B.C. experience has demonstrated that DOCLINE can be useful to Canadian health sciences libraries by:

- 1. Increasing resource sharing in providing access to new collections and to many more collections in North America.
- 2. Reducing processing and turnaround time on ILLs.
- 3. Improving record keeping for interlibrary loans and decreasing overall costs.

Problems were identified as:

- 1. Difficulties in introducing new technology.
- 2. Inaccuracies in Canadian union lists.
- 3. Varying needs of libraries and the problems in reaching consensus on resource sharing issues.

Interest in DOCLINE continues to grow. The CHLA/ABSC Conference in June will provide opportunities to share information and work towards developing a stronger network for resource sharing. There should be much more to report on these developments and the first hand experiences in the Medical and Dental Libraries in the next MHLA news.

INFO-Rx

Library and Information Services for Physicians & the Health Care Community

The University of Manitoba Medical Library has launched a new fee-based library information service to ensure that the Medical Library's resources are available to all Manitobans. The service called INFO-Rx is directed toward the community at large: physicians, other health professionals, attorneys, researchers, government, business, and the general public.

INFO-Rx has its roots in the Library's highly successful Extension Service which for over 15 years was funded by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba and provided special services to rural Manitoba physicians. The cessation of this funding in August 1993 resulted in the development of this new feebased service extended to all non-University users.

The services include: database and reference searches, document delivery, book and AV loans, current awareness subscriptions, as well as teaching and consulting.

INFO-Rx takes advantage of it's access to the province's largest and most comprehensive medical library as well as to greater resources of the University of Manitoba libraries. This includes electronic information facilities such as:

NETDOC (NETworked Databases On Campus) providing access to databases such as Medline, CINAHL, HealthPlan, CancerLit, Neurosciences, Current Contents, PsycLit, Social Work Abstracts and many others.

Online Database Services including NLM/Grateful Med, Dialog, and BRS.

Internet connections to world-wide digital resources such as Cancernet, Genome Databank, OMIM, Online Journal of Current Clinical Trials.

Basic fees start at \$5.00 per article photocopy, \$5.00 per loan and \$30 minimum for a literature

search. Requests will be handled via phone, fax, mail, e-mail and courier. In the near future we will be sending all MHLA members a brochure detailing this new service.
